

Gnoll Estate Country Park Fishing Guide



Fishing permits can be purchased from reception at the visitor centre in Gnoll Estate Country Park on production of a valid Rod License. Rod Licenses are required for those aged 12 years and over. Both daily and seasonal permits are available for purchase.

Permits can also be purchased directly from Skewen Angling Club www.skewenac.com or from local fishing tackle shops.

Fishing Rules:

- Permits must be carried at all times and must be produced on request by either Estate Rangers and/ or water bailiffs.
- Fishing is permitted only from recognised pegs/ angling stations.
- Fishing is only permitted during park opening times.
- Parking is only in approved areas.
- Fishing at the Gnoll Fishpond is only permitted on the East bank and dam wall.
- Only 1 Rod permitted at the Lower Pond.
- No night fishing.
- No keep nets. All fish must be returned to the water.
- Fishers must take litter & tackle home or use the bins provided within the estate.
- All visitors must respect all wildlife.
- If club rules are broke you will be asked to leave the waters.



Stocked Fish:

There is a large quantity of fish in both fishing ponds at Gnoll Estate Country Park. The Environment Agency introduced over 60,000 of these fish to the Gnoll Estate Country Park ponds.

Stocked fish include:

- Carp & Crucian Carp
- Roach
- Gudgeon
- Bream
- Golden Rudd
- Trout
- Tench
- Hybrids and Eels to name a few

Permit Prices:

Day Tickets:

Junior (16yrs and under): £2.00 per Rod

Adult: £5.00 per Rod

Disabled/OAP: £2.00 per Rod

Season Tickets:

Junior: £8.00

Adult: £25.00

Disabled/OAP: £15.00

Permits also provide the additional benefit of allowing fishers to fish at any of the following ponds:

- Tenants Canal
- The Square Pond
- Neath Canal.

All of which are conveniently situated within the County Borough.
